

To the best of my knowledge, these cars stayed mostly on the old Wabash lines after the merger and until Amtrak in 1971. The notable exception is former baggage #375, renumbered #1392, which continues to serve the N&W in its new role as power car #408 in offical train service. In N&W red

with black roof and trucks and gold striping and lettering, the #408 lives on. The only major changes in her appearance (besides paint) are the removal of the underbody skirts and the addition of grilles in the pier panels for the diesel generator.
