The tours for the 2018 convention have been coordinated and secured by VP Dean Taylor and Convention Chairman Todd Arnett.

On Thursday, May 18 registration is running all day in the Mariott. During the scheduled hours, at the Roundhouse a variety of clinics and presentations will be offered for the attendees. The exact schedule will be updated as we firm them up, please check the website for updates. That evening is a meet and greet barbecue at the Museum, come meet old friends and make some new ones.

On Friday the railroad theme tour will be on

Friday May, 18th and include a tour of the Winston Salem Southbound. The WSSB was jointly owned for many years by the N&W and Seaboard. For all visitors, railroad-appropriate attire (long pants, boots) is required. No shorts or open-toed shoes! From there we will travel to the former Southern Rwy Depot in Rural Hall, NC (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Rural Hall Depot) for a visit. From Rural Hall we will retreat south towards Winston Salem, NC and visit the Winston-Salem Southbound Model Railroaders (http://www.sbmrr.org/) and their magnificent model railroad.

Drinks (Coca-Cola products) will be available on the bus and box lunches will be provided that hopefully we can enjoy trackside while at the SR Rwy museum. We will stick to a strict schedule as I know everyone will be eager to return for bit of rest, dinner and the evening photo session. This tour is limited to 55 people and will cost \$35.00

per person. Transportation, lunch and drinks are included in the cost. This tour will depart the Courtyard Marriott at 8:00 AM sharp and will return at 3:00 PM.

The second tour is for those not interested in the aforementioned railroad related tour. This tour is also on Friday May 18th and is a trip to the North Carolina Zoo in Asheboro, NC. This tour will depart the Courtyard Marriott at 8:00 AM and will return at 3:00 PM. Drinks (Coca-Cola products) will be available on the bus and each individual will have the opportunity to purchase their own lunch at the zoo. The tour is limited to 31 people and includes drinks on the bus, transportation, and admission to the zoo. This tour also costs \$35.00 per person. This tour will also be on a strict time schedule in the same manner as the railroad theme tour.
