Members have independent access to the N&WHS Archives in Roanoke, Virginia, where we actively work to preserve the past for the next generation of railroad historians. Documents from the Archives played a critical role in the restoration of the Class J, No. 611 in 2015.

Over 210,000 items have been indexed—about a third of our holdings—we are achieving our goal of preserving N&W and Virginian Railway historical records, data, drawings, and other materials that would otherwise be lost forever.

Our publications are based on or supplemented with information from our Archives. Volunteers are welcome to join on Archives work-sessions. Your membership will help us continue our success!

One of the prime benefits of membership in the Norfolk & Western Historical Society is our quarterly magazine, *The Arrow*, which takes its name from N&W's famous passenger train, *The Powhatan Arrow*.
